




Step 1: Plan your timeline. Place the women’s rights movement events and abolition events on the timeline below.

When is the right time to fight? Did the women’s suffrage movement benefit from the abolitionist movement? Did abolition benefit from women’s suffrage movement?

The women’s suffrage movement and abolitionist movement benefitted from each other because they could not achieve anything without women. For example, Sojourner Truth thought that white women and black women should be treated equally. She suggested that fighting for women’s rights included fighting against slavery. Furthermore, in her speech she said, “That man over there says that women need to be helped into carriages, or over mud puddles, or gives me any best place!” (Ain’t I a Woman, Truth). This quote suggests that Sojourner Truth does not feel that is right to help a woman of a certain race rather than giving the same respect to woman of a certain race rather than giving the same respect to women of all races or nationalities, all women should feel that they are respected by men wherever they go. In conclusion, men could not fight for slavery without the help of women and needed to learn to treat them equal.
